In April 2018, we formally constituted an Advisory Board of Holy Transfiguration Retreat Center, which consists of members of our Diocesan Council, Malankara Church Committee members of our Diocese, along with working professionals from different corners of our Diocese. The responsibilities entrusted to this Advisory Board include, but are not limited to: promoting the mission and vision of this ministry, strategic planning, fundraising, and support for HTRC

Upon their appointment, they went right to work by meeting at the end of April 2018 itself, and offered a dynamic presentation on our spiritual center at our annual Family & Youth Conference.

NEW DIRECTOR

In May 2018, Ms. Mary De Angelis joined the retreat center as its' new Director. Mary brings with her more than two decades of work experience in the non-profit sector as Director of Catholic, interfaith, and secular retreat centers.

Since her arrival, Mary has been instrumental in developing relationships with religious and civic communities, offering the sacred space of our spiritual home to many groups. She has successfully used this network to form a community which offers hope toward building a more compassionate world. An example of this is an event she organized to observe the United Nations International Day of Peace on September 21, 2018 at HTRC. The UN event connected over 2 billion people world wide of diverse religions in a prayer for world peace.

As the year comes to an end, Mary offered her reflection on the mission of HTRC: "His Grace's vision for Holy Transfiguration provides a place dedicated to spiritual education and guidance for his beloved diocese. AREA MEETINGS & PARTNERSHIPS

In July 2018, the Diocesan Council began facilitating meetings each major area of the Diocese. All the Vicars, Assistant Vicars, Secretaries, Trustees, Committee members, Diocesan Assembly members, and ministry leaders in all parishes in each area are encouraged to participate in these meetings.

Such area meetings have been an opportunity to collaborate, and work together in promoting effective ministry, and furthering the sacred mission of our Diocese.

Deliberations on various ministries based in each area are held, along with a detailed presentation on Holy Transfiguration Retreat Center. Members of the Advisory Board of HTRC are also present to facilitate fruitful discussions, and answer questions on this ministry of the Diocese.

Since July 2018, the Bronx/Westchester, Philadelphia, and Brooklyn/Queens/Long Island areas have already met. All areas have renewed their commitment to HTRC. Most notable is the Philadelphia area, who decided that each family in the area should donate at least \$500 to the Diocesan Retreat Center by the end of the current financial year.

This past year Holy Transfiguration Retreat Center, and our Diocese together launched more than five different ministerial initiatives to benefit the faithful of the Malankara Church. It is worthy to note, there were many private programs booked by the Roman Catholic Church, and other private groups as well.





UPDATES & LOOKING AHEAD

In the recent time, the gymnasium is undergoing some serious renovation to ensure it can be used to its fullest potential. This will allow groups who use our center to have more space for meetings, and use it for recreational activities. It is also worthy to note, some areas of the gym's roof has also been repaired.

The Advisory Board has initiated a feasibility study on developing a retirement community, for not only our faithful, but the greater community. It is evident that Pennsylvania has a high retirement population, but it is also seen within our own Keralite Christian community. Many people desire to be close to their loved ones in the northeast United States, and also enjoy fellowship and community during this new chapter of their lives.

We hope to look into the possibility of making Holy Transfiguration Retreat Center, into a place of theological education and enhancement. We have begun a week long Summer Theological Institutes with theological scholars. We hope participants will be granted CEUs in the near future. This will assist us in developing HTRC as a center of Oriental Orthodox Theological education.

Although HTRC is a ministry of the Northeast American Diocese, we hope to continue keep the doors of our spiritual home open to all people who seek refuge in God. This past year we have had more than five groups outside of the Orthodox Church use our facilities. Such groups included: Saint Mary's Roman Catholic Church, the Northeast Pennsylvania chapter of CALM (Cultivating Awareness by Living Mindfully), and Matt Talbot Spiritual Retreats, to name a few.

We envision Holy Transfiguration Retreat Center to be instrumental in transforming the lives of our Malankara Orthodox faithful, and society at large.
